**Cheryl Burnett:** Head Coach Southwest Missouri State (1987-2002) Success was no stranger to Burnett at SMS as she led the Lady Bears to a 319-136 (.701) overall record and an even better 201-65 (.756) conference record in the 15 seasons she coached the SMS women's basketball program. Burnett left Southwest Missouri State as the all-time winningest coach in the school's history. During her tenure at SMS she was honored with several awards including being named Rawlings Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1994, Converse District V Coach of the Year in both 1992 and 1994, and Gateway Conference Coach of the Year in both 1991 and 1992. In addition to her impressive victory totals at SMS Burnett's Lady Bears won nine regular season conference titles, six conference tournament crowns and posted ten 20 game or more winning seasons including the 1991-92 season when they went 31-3 (.912). That same season the Lady Bears were 17-1 (.944) in conference play, first place in the conference and went all the way to the postseason NCAA Tournament Final Four. The team's other Final Four appearance was following the 2000-01 season when their overall record was 29-6 (.829), 16-2 (.889) conference record and a first place tie in-conference. In her 15 seasons at the helm of the SMS women's basketball program she coached the Lady Bears to ten trips to the postseason NCAA tournament, one trip to the WNIT, won the conference title outright seven times including a remarkable six seasons in a row, tied for first place twice, came in second place once and tied for second two other seasons.

**Jackie Stiles:** A basketball star at Southwest Missouri State, where she twice led the NCAA in scoring (2000 and 2001) and won the 2001 Wade Trophy as the nation's best college player. Jackie is the all time leading scorer in the history of women's college basketball, scoring 3393 points. Jackie led the Lady Bears to the Final Four of the 2001 NCAA tournament, gaining national attention as a small-town girl playing for a small-college team. Jackie became the first and so far only NCAA Division I women's player to score more than 1,000 points in a season, scoring 1,062 in her senior year. After college Jackie joined the Portland Fire of the WNBA, and was named the league's rookie of the year in 2001. At Claflin, KS High School, Jackie recorded 3,603 career points, 829 rebounds, 523 assists, and 326 steals as a four-year first team all-stater. She is the leading scorer in Kansas history (boys and girls) and is 10th nationally among female high school players. Jackie averaged a remarkable 46.4 points per game her senior year. She was selected to the USA Today and Parade All-America first-teams in 1997. She scored 18 points and had five rebounds in the NIKE/WBCA All-American Classic in the summer of 1997 and was named MVP of the Red team.
